BUTNER QUARRY

Sunrock's Butner location is more than just a trap rock quarry. It has become the flagship location of the company's operations. As the flagship location, Butner lives up to the goal to be the preferred supplier, employer, and neighbor in the communities in which we operate.

When Bryan Pfohl decided to expand into the southeastern U.S. in 1985, his experiences in western New York and a keen eye for opportunity and strategic vision all played a role in opening this quarry in Butner, North Carolina. Yes, Butner is just a small town north of the Raleigh-Durham area, but as our region rapidly expanded over the last several decades, the Butner quarry has continued to keep pace with the market growth, becoming one of the most prolific aggregate resources in the State of North Carolina. Delivering millions of tons of clean stone into the market, the Butner quarry has and will continue to build roads, schools, highways, airport runways, houses, and businesses in the Raleigh-Durham area and beyond.

From its modest beginnings in 1985, the quarry quickly scaled to meet our growing market. Because the rock type is so durable compared to our competitors it is very desirable for use as railroad ballast. In fact, the trap rock ballast is currently used by Norfolk Southern. In order to better serve our rail customers, the quarry introduced its rapid rail load-out system in 1989. The innovative system can service a 50 – 60 unit car train in three hours, allowing Sunrock to efficiently deliver crushed stone products and industrial materials to customers anywhere in the eastern United States.

In 1996, the Butner location opened a ready-mixed concrete plant onsite and just last year the plant received upgrades to its batch house and office space to improve operational efficiency. In the spring of 2012 longtime customer Barrett, Irvin and Jordan joined Sunrock LLC to be its Contracting Division. Because the Butner complex already housed central dispatch and human resources, it was a natural fit for the rapidly growing contracting division. Today the office is always bustling with project managers, engineers, and team members prepping for the next big construction job or repaving project. To accommodate the company's growing asphalt division, Sunrock constructed its fifth asphalt plant at the Butner complex in 2015. This addition offered customers a unique experience by providing vertical integration of all our products at a single location.

In early 2021, we saw the completion of Sunrock's new safety and training center in Butner. The training center regularly hosts large team meetings and onsite training sessions. The large training space offers a convenient location for team members to collaborate and complete various in-person training throughout the year. This year the long awaited 'over the road' shop and central purchasing warehouse opened its very large hanger doors. This state-of-the-art facility will allow mechanics to better service intercompany haul trucks, ready mixed fleet, and contracting equipment. Today the complex is more than just a quarry, more than just our flagship location, it is truly the heartbeat of Sunrock operations in the United States.

A Letter to Employees

2021 was a tremendous year for Sunrock as we grew our Canadian & US Operations through acquisitions all while providing outstanding service to our customer base. One area that we did not perform up to our expectations was our safety performance. We performed well in safety through November with the US team having a number of serious incidents in



December. In the first quarter of this year both the US and Canada had a number of avoidable safety incidents that we must focus on eliminating as we enter the traditionally busy season.

During 2021, the US completed the Southampton, Virginia acquisition; had a record concrete and FOB asphalt year, grew business levels in our 3 quarries, saw contracting expand relationships with new customers and met our Annual Operating plan targets. In Canada, we completed 3 acquisitions, had a record year at the Uxbridge concrete facility and completed the Burnt River Quarry Production plant in November within budget.

The Burnt River Quarry project was Sunrock's 2nd largest construction project in the past decade which was completed with our US and Canada teams working together to build the state of the art crushing plant that has been producing high quality aggregates since November.

This winter we had a number of facilities undergo major repairs in anticipation of another stellar year and the construction of a new concrete plant in Fenelon Falls which will allow us to produce high quality commercial & residential concrete beginning in May.

Despite the many challenges in hiring and retaining employees, the US grew the number of team members by 45 with Canada growing over 25. We have a great company with committed ownership, outstanding teamwork with strong core values that guide us each day which make Sunrock a great place to work.

The Executive team is currently working on a new Strategic Plan that will focus on improving and growing our current operations as well as where and how we will continue to grow. As all of you can see by the investments Mr. Pfohl and the Pfohl family make in Sunrock, it promises to be an exciting next few years.

During 2022, we will be concentrating on safety and training all of our employees. In addition, Terry Manis will lead our commitment to improve our internal business processes to make our administrative tasks easier. We also have to continue to work on improving product quality at all of our business units and look for ways to improve our operations.

Mr. Pfohl and I truly appreciate everyone's efforts last year and this winter as we prepare for a strong and safe busy season.

Centralized Purchasing

In late 2020, Sunrock's Executive Management Team determined the time had come to centralize our purchasing processes. We formed an Implementation Team consisting of managers from all Sunrock Divisions. Brian Zirbel as Project Chair and Greg Stone as Manager of Purchasing and Sourcing led the project. The team met regularly to identify common parts to inventory, enter information in Viewpoint and develop the purchasing processes. The goals of Centralized Purchasing were to streamline the purchasing process, improve vendor relationships, enhancement of buying power, secure supply and get multiple quotes on parts and services. A big part of the process was to establish a Distribution



Warehouse (DW) to inventory and organize commonly used parts. After clearing the warehouse, a rack system was installed with space to hold over 500 pallets along with ample floor space. By stocking the most commonly used parts on site and having them readily available, we can reduce plant down time and avoid expensive express shipping. In addition, we are able to buy in bulk and leverage our buying power to reduce the cost of parts.

In November of last year, we added a Purchasing and Inventory Specialist to the department. This is a dual role sharing time between the on-road shop parts and Distribution Warehouse. We also brought in Northern Safety to help manage our safety supplies. They visit our site weekly to check inventory levels and restock as needed. This helps free up our Safety Team and keep supplies organized and accessible to our Team Members.

After year one, Centralized Purchasing has proved successful in improving the purchasing processes, finding new vendors, security of supplies and cost savings. We look forward to improving our purchasing processes and working with Division Teams as we approach year two and beyond.

Safety Incentive Program

Sunrock is proud to announce our new Safety Incentive Program! The Safety Advisory Board for the Contracting Division has developed a program that sets us apart from our competition. We believe in putting safety first and strive to "do the right thing." Our new two-part program reinforces this belief by incentivizing Team Members to conduct safer practices and make smarter decisions in the workplace.

Eligible Team Members will earn points for each quarter that they work accident free and will receive 1 ticket per point earned, which will be used for a raffle at the end of the year. Tickets are entered into a drawing for a chance to win three \$7500 Division Prizes including: a Jet Ski, ATV, All-Inclusive Family Vacation, Lowe's/Home Depot Shopping Spree, and a GRAND PRIZE of a new Chevrolet Silverado 4x4 Truck! The drawing will take place at Sunrock's family day in October and you must be present to win prizes. Eligible team members will also earn a unique "Safety Themed" Sunrock branded hat for each accident-free quarter.

Eligibility is tied to at-fault accidents, utility strikes, attendance, Geotab scores, and other related infractions. Eligibility restarts at the beginning of each quarter. Failure to report an accident disqualifies eligibility for the entire year. Team members can earn a bonus point for being accident-free all year for a total of 5 points per year. They can also earn bonus points by submitting qualifying Safety Observations. In addition to the Division Prizes, 1 Rookie of the Year will be selected for each Divisional Group and receive a \$1500 Cash Prize. To be eligible for Rookie of the Year, Team Members must have 6-24 months of service at Sunrock, have earned 2 tickets, and must have perfect attendance.





NCSU Immersion Experience Program

On November 12th, Sunrock team members met up with students from the NC State Civil. Construction, & Environmental Engineering Department's Immersion Experience Program. Sunrock, along with the Town of Morrisville and SEPI, met the students at the Morrisville Carpenter Road Widening Improvement project site near the Morrisville Town Hall and Highway 54. The goal was to show the students different parts of the site and have them get up close and personal with the construction process in a "real world" setting.



Civil engineering students broke up into teams and learned about a variety of

topics at different stations. This included plan reading, utilities, safety hazards, density and soil compactions, and a mock concrete area. At the end, students got to walk the site and see up close the connection between materials covered in their classroom and a project under construction. Sunrock was happy to be a part of this opportunity for students to learn more about safety and concrete mixing while experiencing an active construction site in person – the future is bright!









509 N. Mangum StreetBlake Montgomery, Sr. Commercial Market Manager

The 509 N. Mangum Street Project in Durham is one SOG level and four elevated slab levels. Owned by Trinsic Residential Group, it has a total square footage of 145,285 SF and the site will be covered in 6,765cy of concrete. This project has an 18-week duration from foundations to topping out the Elevated Slabs. 5,000 PSI High Early Deck mix was used for structural slabs to allow for PT Stressing to occur within 48 hours of placement. Carolina Sunrock was fortunate to be named the supplier of this project by Baker Concrete. Baker Concrete is one of the largest concrete finishers in the United States and this is the first project they landed in our market.









Kittrell Class B Stacker

During Kittrell Quarry's maintenance shutdown in early February, a new conveyor was installed to allow for the production of Class B. This creates a new aggregate product to be marketed and sold out of Kittrell that we previously could not make. North Carolina Class B is a 5" - 12" graded stone commonly used for erosion, stream control and fill.

A new 135' long 42" wide Pond River Steel radial stacking conveyor replaced a stationary conveyor (C-12) that feeds the Telsmith 57 SBX standard cone crusher. When the operator wants to make Class B, all he has to do is push a button and the travel motor moves the stacking conveyor to stockpile material. Additionally, if the operator finds that the second surge pile is full, he does not have to shut the middle section of the plant down, therefore increasing efficiency and plant production. As soon as customers found out we were making Class B in Kittrell it immediately started being consumed and sales are increasing week after week.





Morrisville Carpenter Road

Sunrock's Contracting Division started the Morrisville Carpenter Road Project on Jan 25th, 2021. Morrisville Carpenter Road is a major thoroughfare coming from Cary headed towards I-40 and the RDU International Airport which makes it a very busy road during all parts of the day. The Town of Morrisville has had this project in funding since 2015 and they are very excited that construction began last year.

The main components of this project include an upgrade to the existing roadway from a two-lane road to a four-lane divided highway and an intersection upgrade at Town Hall by installing new concrete storm drainage structures and pipes, concrete curb and gutter, ABC Stone, asphalt paving, grading, all new sidewalks and walkways, and an upgrade to the existing culvert while keeping water flowing under the road the duration of the project.

This project is broken out into two major phases in which the culvert has to be completed. Sunrock is working closely with Dane construction to install one half of the culvert (2 – 10' x 7' Cast in Place Box Culverts) while traffic rides on the existing road. Once the culvert has been completed, traffic will drive on a brand new road over the culvert while Sunrock moves on to build the next phase of the roadway and culvert. There have been multiple challenges to keeping the road safe for travelers and workers while having to be almost 20' deep in the ground just a few feet from the travel lane. The first phase of this culvert and the roadway construction was completed in mid-March 2022.

While culvert construction is going on, General Superintendent Preston Laney, Superintendent Reed Logan and Grading Foreman Daniel Williamson have been diligently constructing the new road around the culvert overcoming multiple other conflicts while maintaining a respectful working relationship with the Town of Morrisville and SEPI Engineering.

The planned completion date of the Morrisville Carpenter Road Improvements Project is the Fall of 2022.



















Canada Open House

Sunrock Canada held an Open House on August 13th to celebrate the Grand Opening of our Canadian Headquarters in Uxbridge, Ontario. We appreciate all of the government leaders and other attendees for their interest in our business and joining our celebration. Among those in attendance were Ontario Minister of Finance Peter Bethlenfalvy, Mayor of Uxbridge Dave Barton, Regional Municipality of Durham Chair John Henry, and Sunrock Canada VP & GM Bill Kester.

It was immediately obvious to Sunrock's management team, with the new transportation networks and corridors being built through Durham Region, Kawartha Lakes and York Region that the area is ready for sustained growth. Sunrock has had decades of success based on setting up their businesses in the best locations and in growth areas similar to Durham Region. Construction materials and recycling of construction materials are key ingredients to successful community growth plans. As the different levels of Government work to attract development into areas like Durham Region it is important that construction material providers are situated to support those developments. The closer to the market and growth areas these developers can acquire their construction materials the easier it is on the local road networks and more competitive the development costs will be. Reduced haul distances are better for the environment.

In the last year since entering the Ontario construction materials market we have acquired Spartan Ready-Mix in Uxbridge, Fenelon Ready-Mix Concrete in Fenelon Falls and a large high-quality limestone quarry in the City of Kawartha Lakes. In addition, we have negotiated long-term leases on two local sand and gravel operations in Uxbridge. Sunrock has made a significant investment in property, processing equipment and improved their mobile fleet of mixer and aggregate trucks by adding 14 new Kenworth trucks this year with more coming in 2022. More importantly, we have set up our Canadian Headquarters in Uxbridge with plans to add more office space and jobs in the coming months.

We chose Uxbridge for our headquarters for a variety of reasons. It is centrally located in the area we want to do business in and there is local access to good suppliers that support our business needs. We also have been very pleased with the positive reception since the day we announced to the Township of Uxbridge and Durham Region that we were setting up our Headquarters in the Town of Uxbridge. In the past 12 months Sunrock Canada's workforce has grown from a few to over 55 and we are always seeking out dedicated employees to join our team. We look forward to working together as we grow our business in the region.











VGCC HEO Training Program
