
# Canada Safety Day

# **A Letter To Team Members**

### Sunrock Team,

What an exciting year for Sunrock as 2023 has started off with record levels of business activity across our US quarries as well as the Canadian Burnt River quarry and associated sand & gravel operations.

First and foremost, Mr. Pfohl and I want to ensure that the safety of our team members remains the top priority, and to continue supporting this shared vision, we have invested heavily in training during the first half of 2023. During this period, the US team performed more than 8000 training hours and our Canadian team kicked off the season with their first annual safety day in March. As we move forward through the rest of the summer, we all need to remain diligent in the safety of every team member.

In my December letter, I noted that the Leadership team would be focused on the four pillars that drive our mutual success and below are the key items that we have worked on during the first half of 2023 related to People, Sales & Operations Improvements, Business Processes, and Expansion.

**People:** The investment we have made in training in 2023 is unprecedented and to support our additional investment in our team, we have hired an industry-experienced VP of Human Resources, Andrew Shelton who joins us with over 20 years of human resource experience. Andrew will be responsible for the Human Resources function throughout the entire Sunrock organization.

Sales and Operations improvements: We have the full utilization of recycled material in our US asphalt operation, investment in quality control software in the US concrete business which will be implemented in Canada next year, numerous improvements at our quarries, and a significant investment in our US contracting general contractor program led by Blake Montgomery and Michael Phillips. Under Jeremy Lee's leadership, our revamped Canadian sales team is working to integrate the proven US sales processes and develop a diversified customer base.

**Business Processes:** In January, a cross-functional team led by David Heyen mapped out our entire logistics process and during the second half of this year and into 2024, the US will be moving onto the newly upgraded software platforms with Canada upgrading in 2024. These upgrades will provide cleaner, simpler, and timelier information that will allow us to refocus time and energy on our customer base. In addition to the software upgrades that will eliminate a tremendous amount of paper, we will be opening our state-of-the-art centralized logistics center, which is scheduled for the second half of 2024.

**Expansion:** In addition to expanding our concrete & haul truck fleets, purchasing cement silo's for our Canadian concrete plants, new equipment for our contracting division, and continued investments in our quarries; our strategic expansion activity continues. I look forward to sharing more details this fall on several exciting announcements that will expand our US and Canadian businesses.

In addition, with Alex Culpepper leading the way, we have developed a new market for our unique Butner material that focuses on capturing carbon emissions.

All of the above items would not be possible without the support of Mr. Pfohl, the Pfohl family, and our Board of Directors. They collectively continue to invest in our team members and the Sunrock business.



# **Wake County Speedway Rehabilitation**

We have been extremely excited to work with Wake County Speedway, "America's Favorite Bullring", Onslow Grading & Paving, and RLT & Associates on the repave and rehabilitation of this historic race track. Founded back in 1962, Wake County Speedway is a quarter-mile asphalt race track located about fifteen minutes south of Downtown Raleigh, North Carolina. Sunrock has supplied approx. 1,000 tons of surface for the repave and not only does the new surface look great, but it is incredibly fast according to drivers at the track.

# **Uxbridge Facility Silos**

In June, Sunrock Canada's Uxbridge facility in Ontario was successful in safely installing two new vertical silos at the location. These new silos allow for an additional 320 tons of added capacity for GUL and other cementitious inventory. Both of these new silos have radar inventory and are connected to a 60 HP blower to transfer the product into the plant. This extra on-hand cement capacity will allow our Uxbridge facility to become more reliable and competitive in the market, being able to take on more mass pours in the area.



# **NCSU Plant Sciences**

Construction on the \$160 million state-of-the-art Plant Sciences Building located on NC State's Centennial Campus kicked off in September of 2019. This 187,000 square foot facility opened its doors in 2021 and has brought the brightest minds in academia, government, and industry together to tackle the grand challenges in agriculture. Sunrock supplied approx. 6,700 yards of concrete from various plants and 2,000 tons of aggregate from the Butner and Kittrell quarries. The concrete finisher on this project was Honducom Concrete Inc. This project is another example of Sunrock & Honducom Concrete working together to overcome various obstacles and challenging situations in order to give the customer a quality product.

Access to cutting-edge tools and equipment, co-working spaces, and teams of interdisciplinary researchers allows both industry and academia to effectively collaborate to address grand challenges facing food, health, and agriculture. The 185,000 sq. ft. world-class facility is home to a 1,050 sq. ft. laboratory, think tank, three core facilities, four growth chambers, eleven rooftop greenhouses, demo lab, open office and collaborative spaces, as well as seminar and event spaces for continued learning.
